6 things you didn't know before



THE POLLINATOR TEAM

Bees (of course!), butterflies, hoverflies, beetles, moths, birds and bats!



Over 200.000 species of animals are pollinators!

MORE THAN HONEYBEES



There are nearly 600 species of wild bees in Germany. Most live solitarily and fly under the radar—but they play a huge role in our ecosystems.

ONE IN THREE BITES



33% of our food depends on pollinators - including apples, almonds, zucchinis and blueberries

BUMBLEBEES CAN BUZZ

Certain plants (like tomatoes) release pollen only when vibrated. Bumblebees grab the flower and shake it at a specific frequency — a technique called buzz pollination.



MANY BEES LIVE UNDERGROUND



Around 70% of wild bee species nest in the ground, not in “bee hotels”



POLLINATION EXPLAINED



Pollinators transport pollen from the male parts of a flower to the female parts, so the plant can produce seeds and fruits.



HELP OUR POLLINATORS

Plant native flowers. Build nesting sites. Avoid harsh chemicals. Leave the dandelion.
